4

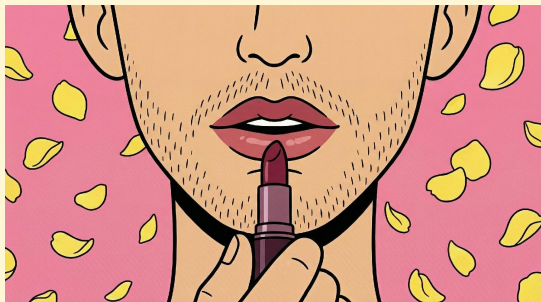
We learn together

Guiding question: How can we create a global queer tango network focused on solidarity and awareness-raising?

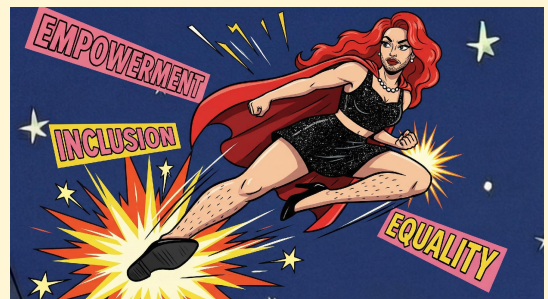
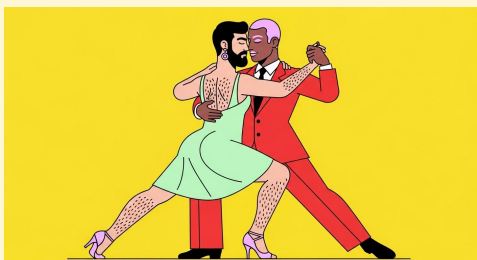
